

Frequency in the Majority

These charts display how frequently each justice voted in the majority in decisions filed during the period September 1, 1998, to August 31, 1999. The first chart includes all cases in which a justice voted (out of the total of 79 cases, specified above), while the second chart includes only cases decided by split votes.

All Cases<sup>1</sup>

Non-Unanimous Decisions<sup>2</sup>

| Abrahamson | 9                   | 22               | 41%                 |
| Bradley    | 9                   | 23               | 39%                 |
| Crooks     | 18                  | 23               | 78%                 |
| Steinmetz  | 22                  | 23               | 96%                 |
| Wilcox     | 18                  | 22               | 82%                 |
| Prosser    | 18                  | 23               | 78%                 |
| Bablitch   | 19                  | 23               | 83%                 |

<sup>1</sup> **Justice Abrahamson** did not vote in *Sawyer v. Midelfort*; *Riccitelli v. Broekhuizen*; and *Arneson v. Jezwinski*. **Justice Bradley** did not vote in *Wausau Tile, Inc. v. County Concrete Corp.* **Justice Wilcox** did not vote in *Elections Bd. v. Wisconsin Mfrs. & Commerce*; and *Sharp v. Case Corp.* **Justice Prosser** did not vote in *State v. Curiel (In re Curiel)*; *State v. Kienitz (In re Kienitz)*; and *State v. Sprosty (In re Sprosty)*. **Justice Steinmetz** did not vote in *Ness v. Digital Dial Communs., Inc.*
